On the occasion of the first trip to South America by Mr. Niger Fisher, Head of MINUSTAH, RESDAL organized different activities including the Discussion-Debate: 'The Present and Future of the Peace Mission in Haiti', which was held in Buenos Aires on May 21st, and the Conference: 'The Present and Future of MINUSTAH', held in Montevideo, Uruguay on May 23rd.

In Buenos Aires, the event was organized with the support of the Canadian Embassy in Argentina, where the event was held. The opening speech was carried out by the Canadian Ambassador, Mrs Gwyneth Kutz, and Paz Tibiletti, President of RESDAL.

In Montevideo, the event was held in the 'Blue Helmets' lecture hall, which is shared by the Escuela Nacional de Operaciones de Paz del Uruguay (E.N.O.P.U.), the Sistema Nacional de apoyo a las Operaciones de Mantenimiento de la Paz (SINOMAPA) and the Centro de Altos Estudios Nacionales (CALEN), and organized by the Ministry of National Defence and the Uruguayan Joint Chief of Staff with the assistance of RESDAL. Juan Rial (member of the RESDAL Board of Directors) and Paz Tibiletti, opened the event prior to the opening speech, which was made by Uruguayan Defence Minister, Dr Jorge Edgardo Menéndez.

On both occassions, the principal speaker, Mr Nigel Fisher, highlighted the advances in the Mission, which was followed by a high-level discussion focused on the situation of Haiti in the current context of peace operations. Amongst other points, he presented the work carried out by the Mission and the advances made in terms of stabilization and the consolidation of Haitain security forces. Furthermore, Fisher highlighted the importance of focusing the funds assigned to the mission on a smaller range of objectives, identifying particular areas to which the majority of funds should be directed, given that funding levels are decreasing. To this respect, he reaffirmed that: "We should not do more with less. We should do less, with less".


