UPEACE Champions Global Action Against Organized Crime at World Compliance Forum 2025

The University for Peace, in partnership with the Latin American Federation of Compliance (FELADE) and the Financial Analysis Unit (UAF) of the Dominican Republic, co-hosted the World Compliance Forum 2025 on June 26–27 in Santo Domingo. This high-level international forum convened experts from across Latin America – including Colombia, Brazil, Costa Rica, Venezuela, Mexico, and the Dominican Republic – to tackle urgent challenges in regulatory compliance, institutional governance, and the fight against financial and transnational crime.

Representing UPEACE were key voices in the global conversation: Dr. Maurício Vieira, Director of the Chair on Combating Illicit Trade and Preventing Transnational Organized Crime; Karen Acosta, Director of the Department of Regional Studies; and Gabriela Montero, Program Coordinator and Academic Officer. Their leadership reinforced UPEACE's mission to cultivate ethical leaders, strengthen democratic institutions, and uphold the rule of law as a cornerstone of peace and sustainable development.

Headquartered at UPEACE's Geneva office, the Center positions itself as a strategic hub for multilateral dialogue and advanced training in international diplomacy.

The Geneva Multilateral Center is designed to foster cooperation among regional blocs, enhance diplomatic skills, and promote peace through academic programs, policy forums, and international collaboration networks. The initiative was spearheaded by Ambassador David Fernández Puyana, UPEACE's Permanent Observer to the United Nations in Geneva, reflecting the institution's growing role in shaping global diplomacy.

UPEACE proudly celebrates the successful inauguration of the Multilateral Cooperation Research Institute and the Student Talent Base for International Organizations, two landmark initiatives launched in Beijing, China to strengthen the next generation of global leadership.

These new projects, developed in partnership with the Beijing Yaoyang Foundation and the Beijing Bacui Bilingual School, aim to deepen international educational cooperation and promote multilateralism through academic innovation and diplomatic engagement.

Ms. ZHANG Xinyuan, UPEACE China Centre representative, will serve as Executive Dean alongside Ms. Jiang Dan, founder and Director of the Beijing Bacui Bilingual School and Deputy Director of the Beijing Yaoyang Foundation—underscoring a strong, shared commitment to international collaboration and educational excellence.
