Last week, a group of 20 professionals from Costa Rica, Mexico, Argentina, Nicaragua, Colombia and Guatemala - including beloved staff member Andrea Guadamuz - completed the first module (certification) of our M.A. in International Human Rights Law, carried out in partnership with the Costa Rican Bar Association. Nineteen participants will now continue with the second module (specialization) and hopefully, with the third module, which will result in a master's degree from the University for Peace. Students who complete all three modules will graduate with the rest of the UPEACE Class of 2024.
