Mohamed Osman began the year crowned as one of the Somalian publication Five Magazine's 25 most influential Somalians of 2024. Residing in the United Kingdom, the 37-year-old economist plays an instrumental role in Somalian President Hassan Sheikh Mohamoud's key policies. He is a member of the government's National Economic Council and took part in last year's Nairobi negotiations that led to Somalia's admission to the East African Community. He is an advocate for environmental issues and helped his country join the Great Green Wall of the Sahara and the Sahel, a project involving around 20 African nations aimed at the reforestation of desert areas, the same year.
