UPEACE and League of Arab States Forge Historic MoU in Geneva to Advance Peace and Coexistence

In a historic ceremony at the United Nations headquarters in Geneva, Ambassador David Fernandez-Puyana, Permanent Observer of the University for Peace to the UN in Geneva, and Ambassador Bayoudh, representative of the League of Arab States, signed a Memorandum of Understanding, marking the beginning of a new era of strategic cooperation. The signing was supported by Ambassador Abdullah of the Kingdom of Bahrain, President of the Council of Arab Ambassadors.

This agreement paves the way for the development of new programs aimed at promoting peace, coexistence, and interregional dialogue, with a particular focus on the Middle East. The initiatives will seek to strengthen understanding and create effective cooperation spaces between the parties, grounded in the principle that dialogue is essential for peaceful conflict resolution and sustainable development.
